### RESEARCH REPORT

Since the last report in March, the Research Team, when not carrying out research requests, have kept ourselves busy with some research projects.

Wendy W and I have begun documenting the pioneer settlers of the Lurg area based on the names on early parish maps, with the aim of publishing a booklet in the future. Wendy is also researching the history of the district so that she can produce a new information board for the Winton Cemetery. In order to obtain documents and other information, an "Early Lurg" Tree has been created on Ancestry, which has been made private. So far, the following families have been entered and researched:

Another private Ancestry Tree, "Benalla and district Research" has also been created to aid in research of local people and their families. At present, the names include:

Wendy M and Wendy W have completed their research on "Lone Graves of Benalla and District" and are preparing the material for publication.

We have also had a number of people from out of town calling into our rooms wanting help with finding out about their relatives who lived in Benalla and district, or wanting to do their own research from our library and other resources.

A good quality photo scanner is now available, and we are able to scan family photographs and touch them up, or repair them if possible.

# **BOOK COLLECTION**

It is a vast collection of books covering all sorts of genealogical information from Birth, death, and marriage data, to how to write your family history, and most of the information on how to do just that. It is a wonderful variety of books that should help a lot of family history buffs solve their brick walls. I advise you to come in (Wait, hold on a minute, AFTER they a catalogued into our library) and take a look. England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales feature in volume.

## **CONVICT SETTLERS OF BENALLA**

Our research team has carried out over a period of time, research into the lives of convicts to Australia, who settled in Benalla, and are buried in Benalla or Winton cemeteries. In past newsletters I have related the stories of John Ackers, and Benjamin Gould. This is the story of Barbara Kerr/Vincent.

Born in Luswade (Lasswade) near Edinburgh, Scotland, about1811, Barbara's father was John Kerr. Her death certificate, which was filled in by her son, George, states her mother's name as "unknown". Her mother's maiden name may have been Fraser, but as yet, this is unproven.

Barbara was charged in the Edinburgh Court of Judiciary on the 12<sup>th</sup> March 1828, for stealing a gold watch from a gentleman, and sentenced to 7 years transportation. At the time she was living with her uncle Glanville Fraser who was a tailor. She left London on the 11<sup>th</sup> May 1828, on board the "Borneo", and arrived in Hobart Tasmania on the 8<sup>th</sup> October 1828. She was aged 17 years. On her convict records she is described as 5'61/2" tall, brown hair, grey eyes, small nose, medium mouth, chin large full pointed, and various other markings, scars etc. She could not read or write, and her occupation was listed as farm servant on her arrival in Tasmania.

She was an inmate of the Cascades Female Factory in Hobart, which was built between 1826 and 1828, in the shadow of Mt. Wellington, on the land of an old distillery plant owned by Thomas Yardley Lowe. It was said to be a very cold and dark place, next to a rivulet, and less than idyllic for the inmates. If a female convict fell pregnant, she was sent to the Factory to give birth. Once the child was born, the mother had to serve six months of hard labour, for getting pregnant. The man got off scot-free.

Barbara married James Bly (or Bligh) on the 5<sup>th</sup> November 1832 in Norfolk Plains, Launceston. She was charged and confined again in 1832 for assaulting and wounding her husband, and also for not living with him. John Bly (Bligh) died in1835 in New Norfolk, Tasmania.

It is unknown how Barbara met George Vincent, but they had a child born to them on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 1839, in new Norfolk, who they called Jane Hill Vincent. On their Permission to Marry Certificate, George is described as a "Writer", who came to Tasmania as a free man. According to the records they were married in Launceston on the 6<sup>th</sup> October 1841. Their second child named George Vincent, was born in Launceston, Tasmania, on the 18<sup>th</sup> December 1843. They are the only children listed on both George and Barbara's death certificates.

George and Barbara were living in Benalla by 1857, though no shipping records of their trip to the mainland have been found as yet.

Their daughter Jane married Charles Adams on the 24<sup>th</sup> November in that year, in the Old Court House in Benalla. They went on to produce 10 children, all born in Benalla, with many of them marrying and dying in Benalla also.

Jane died in Benalla on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 1889.

Her son George Vincent married Mary Ann Kelly, probably in Benalla, and their 5 children were all born in Benalla. At least 4 of these children went on to live, marry, have children, and die in Benalla.

George and Barbara are both buried in Benalla Cemetery, but in unknown graves.
