
LIMA PARK OPEN GARDEN & HOMESTEAD GUIDED TOUR

The new Benalla Library

Our group was invited to put together a display for the large display cabinet located in the new Benalla library this month and to host an afternoon tea. The display is now up and running for the whole of August.

The theme for this display is Your Family Tree - researching, compiling and producing a Family Tree to display on your wall.

O'Connor Family

On display was the professionally printed and framed O'Connor family tree which was researched and completed by our group in past months.

The O'Connor tree is produced in the bow tie style with the descendant in the centre and ancestors radiating from his fathers and mothers sides. Only direct ancestors are included although the rest of the families were added in note book form along with references.

Jonathan Harris

His story starts in Sussex England where he was born. It involves a crime that resulted in him being transported to NSW and also Tasmania, several marriages, many children and his eventual arrival in Benalla where he lived until his death in 1891 at the age of 91. Not a bad innings after such a harsh start to his life in the Colonies!

How was this story of his life discovered?

It involved much hard work over many years searching for the details of his and his family's story. Today information available on the internet makes it a little easier to research, however proof from documents including certificates is still needed to ensure that you have the correct family. The search comprised of hunting for-

- Records of birth, death and marriage and baptisms in Australia and England.
- Wills and probate records
- Convict records
- Court records in England
- Newspaper articles
- Relatives who had family stories, photos and more.
- Diaries and family bibles
- Rates records and maps

RATE BOOK INDEX

Bill has been working on the corrections and correlation of all the transcribed "Farmers" in the rate books up to 1889. It has been, and continues to be a massive job, as there are more Farmers, Graziers and Squatters in the early years than the already indexed Business people.

There are staggering numbers of Farmers, Graziers, Squatters, Gentlemen, Domestics, Clergymen, Ministers, Reverends, Servants Herdsmen in this list that have never been indexed before. Something like 16,000 entries from 1880 to 1889, and 12,500 from 1869 to 1879 have been added to the original rate index over the past 6 months.

Names have been found to be spelt up to 5 different ways for the same person, so an attempt has been made to put them all together in a coloured block, so that when accessing your particular name, the different versions of the spelling are also available. That is not to say that Bill has found all the different spellings but has found a few, along with some doozies that weren't so obvious.

So next time you meet Bill in the street and his eyes are going round in circles, you'll know why. We are still looking for some eager and willing people to transcribe more entries, remembering that the Rate Books go up to 1994. That's nearly fifty years of rates to go, so still a massive job in front of us, but thank heavens, it is appreciated by most of the researchers. Our own Research team has had the whip out for months.

<u>HISTORY</u>

Lima Park today is the home section of what was originally known as Lima Station.

William McKellar took up Lima Station in May 1839 then in 1841 he became involved with William

Black in a business partnership known as 'Black and McKellar'. The boundaries of these Stations were not really defined at this time but in 1847, after a boundary dispute between William McKellar and some of his neighbours, a contract surveyor was engaged to draw accurate maps of the area. The surveyor's calculations show that the area of Lima Station was 88,000 acres.

McKellar and Black continued as business partners at Lima Station until 1853 when the partnership was dissolved. William McKellar took over the lease and was one of the few squatters who actually lived and worked on his property. By the 1860's Benalla was growing considerably and in 1861 Benalla was proclaimed a town and by 1869, a Shire.

McKellar built up his stock numbers to 15,000 sheep and 12,000 head of cattle and in 1863, the station was split, into 'Lima Run' on the western side of the Broken River and 'Samaria Run' on the eastern side of the Broken River.

In 1865 William McKellar had started to fence some of this property and advertised in the Ovens and Murray newspaper for

'Teamsters and Others. Wanted - fencers with teams, for five miles more or less, of brush fence. Level ground, thickly timbered. Apply Wm McKellar Lima Station, Benalla'.

McKellar was also keen to improve his cattle herds and brought in good breeding bulls, however he had trouble with rogue wild bulls that damaged his breeding programs and ate good pasture. In 1865-7 he advertised and arranged weekend hunts 'under the title of 'Wild Bull Hunting at Lima Station'.

William McKellar had become a man of some standing in the community and in 1874 he was appointed as a Licensing Magistrate for the Benalla District. On 18th May 1875, the North Eastern Ensign, Benalla, reported that William McKellar's Lima Station was sold in a private sale to 'Messrs Wilson & Co. of Borodomanin Run at a satisfactory figure'.

By 1876-William McKellar had bought property in Benalla and his occupation in the Benalla rates entries changed from Squatter to Gentleman. According to his Will & Probate details, he built a large 13 roomed brick and timber house on 4 acres with frontages to Market Street and Garden Street where he lived until his death in 1893 at the age of 95, having outlived his wife Rachel, and son James. The net value of his estate in 1893 was £1595.

In 1885 S. Wilson sold Lima Station to the Morrison Bros who in turn sold it on in 1893. It was then leased for about 5 years by T Cowan, owner of Yin Barun.

In 1898 H.Gidney bought Lima Station, which then comprised just over 4,000 acres of land.

From 'Cultural Rural Landscape of Lima' by Elizabeth Peck:

Gidney built his imposing new homestead in 1901 on the site of McKellar's house. The new, large 60 square brick homestead comprised sixteen rooms and several outhouses. Its design in the fashionable Federation style of the early 1900's included detailed ornamentation, embellished verandahs and lattice which enclosed outhouses and divided sections of the back gardens. Elaborate fretwork surrounding roof lines, verandahs, porches and windows as well as decoration inside the house gave the building an ornate appearance, unusual for a country homestead. Its Edwardian garden of lawns, shrubs, trees, including many different species of palms and a variety of citrus trees as well as shaped flower and rose beds, and sweeping gravel drive reflected Gidney's interest in India. He and his family made eighteen visits to India during his ownership of 'Lima' in connection with his lucrative business of shipping horses there to be used in the cavalry.

The government acquired the Lima estate in 1948, planning to subdivide it into Soldier Settlement blocks. 'Eight allotments were offered with the homestead now being offered as a single unit farm' ... 'It was the policy of the government to acquire land owned by absentee landlords or large property which had become run down. 'Lima' was to be in fact the fourth family property acquired by the government.'

The story of Lima Park continues with present owners Mr and Mrs White kindly opening their lovely house and gardens to the public and the Benalla Family Research Group wishes to thank them for their generosity.
