#### LIBRARY REPORT

The Family History Research Group now has over 3,400 books, over 400 CDs and 219 microfiche catalogued in the library. A large amount of these resources are not found on the Internet, so please as members, utilize these resources whenever you are in the vicinity of our Group.

#### RESEARCHING SUCCESS

Recently a researcher I was helping, obtained an 1881 Marriage certificate for his great grandparents from the NSW Registry of Births Deaths and Marriages.

He needed to know the name of the groom's mother and father.

Unfortunately, although the town where the marriage took place was named, the groom's parents were not named on the certificate.

- As there was also no death found for the groom, a lot of research went into finding out through other means just who his parents might be.
- Everything seemed to point to a couple who didn't register any of the births of their children, but we had NO PROOF.
- Even though we had the Marriage certificate,

I decided to try to find this marriage on the family search website.

https://www.familysearch.org You must log on, but there are no fees involved.

BINGO there it was!



It was a record of this Marriage naming the bride and groom, their parents and the name of the Church.

 This led to the researcher emailing and obtaining a Copy of the Certificate of Marriage from the Church office. This showed everything, both sets of parents, and witnesses etc.

NOTE: We were advised that in NSW, the Church in the later 1880s did not have to provide parent's names when sending details to the Registrar.

Editor's Note: There are many places to research your family history. Some people write their journals and then upload them and their Family Trees to specific web sites for you to tap into. One that I have used it Family Tree Circles. www.familytreecircles.com

Make yourself an ID, log in and look for your family name and see if anyone else is looking for the same family.

#### UNITED MOVE TO BE MADE

A united effort by the Borough Council and the Benalla branch of the Victorian Teachers' Union is to be made to have a full technical school established at Benalla, and representations will be made to the Minister for Education when he visits Benalla next month.



The matter was brought forward at Monday night's meeting of the Borough Council by Cr. S. R. Harris, who moved that representatives of the Council confer with members of the Benalla V.T.U. to prepare a case for submission to the Minister for Education for the establishment of a full technical school at Benalla.



In seconding the motion, Cr. Ferguson said that Benalla lost its students to Wangaratta when they first started, and that town had never looked back.

Cr. Say said there was conflict of policy in the Department as to whether it was better to have full technical schools or a combined school. If there was to be two distinct heads, there was likely, to be the problem of competition. He was in a

quandary as to the right attitude they should adopt. He felt they would have to be wisely guided.

Cr. Harris said the best solution was two separate schools like Wangaratta.

At a full technical school, the students received the true technical training, and there was no competition. Cr. Talochino said the biggest problem would be the fight against school consolidation. Cr. Say said that they would have a strong case with the proposed camp to be established here and proposed new industries. Cr. Harris said the town was urgently in need of full



facilities for apprenticeship in Benalla. The motion on being put was carried unanimously,

#### How to get started on your search.

Start with yourself and family records such as birth, christenings, marriage, or death certificate. Use family stories as a base for verification of events.

Family school records, photos, awards, and service records, deeds, family bibles. Obituary notices, diaries, letter and cards, etc.

You can obtain information from the Records Office, census returns, military / navy records, probate records, land and property (titles), Church records, naturalisation records, court and inquest records, shipping records (overseas and inwards), newspapers (state or local library), history groups.

Visit family history groups and museums to get an understanding of their daily lives and the hardships your family endured. Visiting
